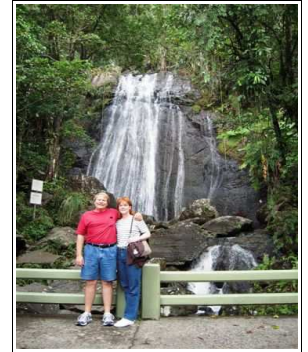
DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

OTHER LEGISLATIVE MISCHIEF

AAHC and legislative report:

- **The AZ State Legislature is in session. They have been so busy with the State budget they haven't had time to do much damage yet. Imposing a sales tax on private auto sales transactions being discussed and will probably be introduced later.**
- **HB2338 has been introduced and is a bill to establish a uniform traffic light standard statewide. This would make the duration of the amber light the same in all jurisdictions and eliminate the practice of shortening the duration at intersections where traffic cameras are installed. Studies show that shortening the duration of the amber light by one second result in a 120% increase in red light violations at camera equipped intersections. There has been a resolution introduced into the house to repeal the photo radar law. If photo radar tickets go unanswered or un served after 120 days they are dismissed. There has been a petition to the Supreme Court to make the registered owner of the car responsible for the ticket without service. The Judges have a vested interest since part of the fine goes to the judges fund and the clean election fund.**
- **The AAHC is establishing an email system through all clubs to alert club members statewide to legislative issues which affect the hobby as they arise. This would allow members to take appropriate and timely action in contacting their elected representatives.**

Mr. Phil Neri, V.P. of Marketing had authorized daily passes for our regional members and booth space at no cost to our region provided we only did membership solicitation, which we did. Where else can you find an opportunity such as this with over 200,000 car guys? We do understand the value of these spaces and do hope that it was truly beneficial to both parties as all collector car clubs do a valuable service to the hobby in return.

We opened on Monday January 18th at 10 am to 4pm, through Sunday January 24th with 15 of our hardy club member volunteers braving some unseasonably rainy, windy days, which unfortunately caused us to close on Thursday and Friday. On a side note; one neighboring auction had their tents blown across a local freeway tying up traffic for hours and thankfully no one was hurt although some great classic cars did suffer damage. Barrett-Jackson was both lucky and smart as they had semi trailers lined up along their main auction tent at the height of the storm which really helped secure and avoid any damage to the large Westworld facility where the event is held.

At our booth, we gave out National and Local applications, copies of the '*Self Starter*' magazine plus a copy of the listing of all the possible club contacts in the prospects home area. The key handout and selling tool were the many '*Self Starter*' magazine copies. One gentlemen sat by our booth for 20 minutes reading the section on cars for sale. We sold the value of this magazine plus the technical help in it and also, the terrific help one can expect from their local club members in maintaining their Classic Cadillac or LaSalles.

We also had a guest book they had to sign in on and of course a valuable follow-up tool for our local club membership person. We had 27 people visit our booth and half of them were from out of town. They all took applications and their local club address list. One from the Valley Forge club area actually paid us the fees /apps and they were forwarded to that club. We hope to add 5 members or more from the Phoenix area so that basically met our goal going into this project.

To recap, it was a worthwhile challenge and our booth volunteers had a great time as well just being around all those 1200 classic and muscle cars which were auctioned off. We hope to repeat this again next year and encourage all Cadillac Clubs to do the same in their states with this promotional, membership idea.
